The summer vacation is around the corner and it is a period when you can spend quality time with your child and ensure their learning.

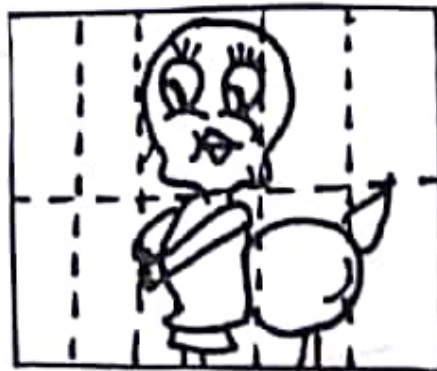
Here are some tips to make this time fruitful and a happy period for your child-

- Have at least two meals together with your child. Teach them the importance and hardwork of the farmers and tell them not to waste food.
- Share your childhood experiences with your child and introduce them to story books and narrate bedtime stories.
- Allow your child to play outdoors, get dirty and get hurt. It's okay for them to fall down and experience pain once in a while.
- Visit the grandparents and let your child develop bond with them. Their love and emotional support is extremely important for your child's overall development.

Please send the following teaching aids in a well-labelled folder/file on the first day when the school reopens after the summer break.

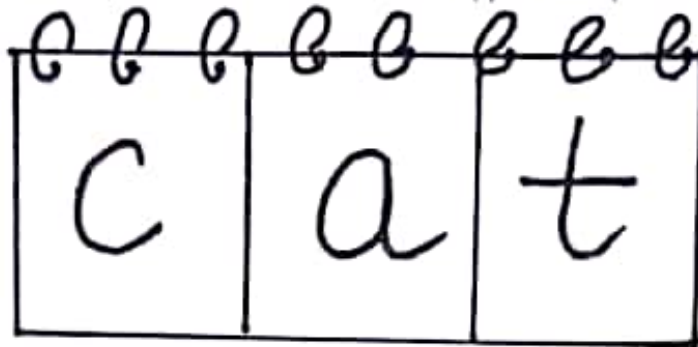
1. Make a 10 piece puzzle

- On an A4 size sheet, print/ draw your child's favourite animal/fruit/ cartoon character.
- Paste the same on a cardboard.
- Laminate the same using broad transparent tape.
- Cut the sheet into 10 equal parts.
- Number the parts on the backside.
- Send the puzzle in a neat well-decorated transparent box.



2. Make your own reading book

- Take 26 half A4 size sheets.
- Cut the sheets into three equal parts (as shown in fig. 1).
- On the first strip of paper, write letters a to z in lowercase (follow the pattern given in the notebook).
- On the second strip of paper, write the vowels (a,e,i,o,u).
- On the third strip of paper, write the letters t, g, d, m, p, b, n.
- Get the book spiral bind from the upper end (as shown in fig. 2)



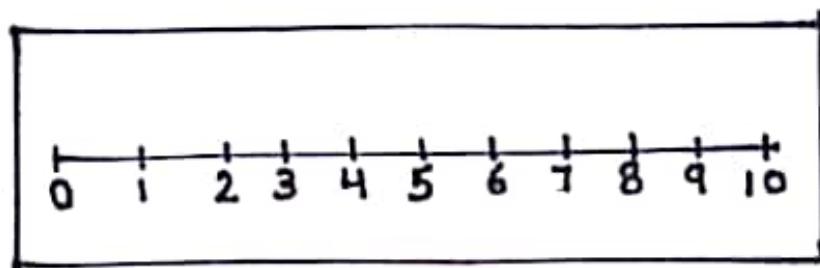
3. Make your own table mat

- On an A3 size sheet, paste your child's photograph.
- Put your child's hand impressions below the photo.
- Laminate the same.



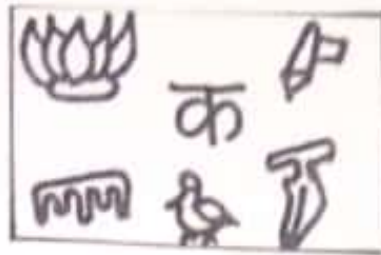
4. Make your own number line

- On a white coloured paper strip (15 inches × 5 inches), draw a number line with a black coloured sketch pen (refer fig.3)
- Mention the child's name at the back of the number line.
- Laminate the same. (Do not use transparent tape)



5. Mera hindi shabd kosh

- Take 17 A4 size sheets.
- On each page, write the Hindi varna (क - ङ), on the top.
- With each varna, help your child to paste at least 5 vocabulary pictures.
- Spiral bind the pages to make a picture dictionary.
- Label the same with your child's name and class.



6. Do the following task in a separate notebook and make your word practice the following concepts

- Aa -Zz
- क - ङ
- Counting 1-10
- Missing Numbers
